

## **Open Access Resolution of the University of Freiburg**

As a 21st century comprehensive university, the University of Freiburg is dedicated to providing an independent and critical space for developing revolutionary innovations and educating future generations on the basis of freedom of research and instruction. It is committed to fulfilling its responsibility of putting the knowledge and collective achievements of its scholars at the disposal of society at large. The University of Freiburg sees the open access publication paradigm as an innovative means of allowing everyone free and equal access to academic findings and, at the same time, ensuring that these findings receive the attention they deserve in the general public. According to the Berlin Declaration<sup>1</sup> on Open Access to Knowledge in the Sciences and Humanities, an open access publication must satisfy the following two conditions:

"The author(s) and right holder(s) of such contributions grant(s) to all users a free, irrevocable, worldwide, right of access to, and a licence to copy, use, distribute, transmit and display the work publicly and to make and distribute derivative works, in any digital medium for any responsible purpose, subject to proper attribution of authorship (community standards will continue to provide the mechanism for enforcement of proper attribution and responsible use of the published work, as they do now), as well as the right to make small numbers of printed copies for their personal use."

"A complete version of the work and all supplemental materials, including a copy of the permission as stated above, in an appropriate standard electronic format is deposited (and thus published) in at least one online repository using suitable technical standards (such as the Open Archive definitions) that is supported and maintained by an academic institution, scholarly society, government agency, or other well established organization that seeks to enable open access, unrestricted distribution, inter operability, and long-term archiving."

Open access publications in recognized and peer-reviewed media achieve a higher level of general accessibility than comparable publications in limitedaccess media. Publications in the open access format thus serve to improve the accessibility of academic work and thus also the public visibility of the scholars who wrote it and the institutions where they did the research. the publication platform FreiDok, the university is already in possession of an – also in international comparison – outstanding format for open access publications. In the "Ranking Web of World Repositories," FreiDok placed 47<sup>th</sup> among all institutional repositories worldwide (as of 01/2010).<sup>2</sup> FreiDok enables primary as well as secondary publications. Due to the increasing significance of open access publications, the publication portal FreiDok is currently being improved to include better functionality and meet the needs of scholars more adequately.

Thus, the University of Freiburg actively encourages its researchers to present their findings to the worldwide scientific community as well as to the general public in the open access format. These authors are entitled to retain the usage rights for the electronic versions of their publications. The Freiburg University Library provides authors advising and support for this purpose.
